Narrative

Mike Douglass is the Director of the Globalization Research Center and is Professor and former Chair of the Department of Urban and Regional Planning at the University of Hawai'i (UH). He received his Ph.D. in Urban Planning from UCLA. He previously taught at the Institute of Social Studies (Netherlands) and at the School of Development Studies, University of East Anglia (U.K.). He has also been a Visiting Professor at Stanford University, UCLA, and Thammasat University.

A specialist in planning in Asia, he has lived and worked for many years in Asian countries, including Japan, Korea, Indonesia and Thailand. He has joined numerous research and planning projects and has been a consultant for international development institutions as well as national and local governments in Asia. He has advised university programs in planning education in Indonesia, Australia, China, and the U.S.

Current research in Asia: 2004-2007 grants total approximately US\$1 million in several research projects and training programs, including those in (1) livable cities (the environment, personal well-being, and public space); (2) urbanization and civic space with research teams in 10 countries; (3) mega-urban region dynamics (6 cities); (4) international migration and the globalization of householding (Vietnam, Singapore, Taiwan and Japan); (5) short-course training for urban specialists in research and planning; (6) The global water agenda and the rural-urban transition in Asia (Vietnam); (7) rural-urban linkages and rural regional development.
